TOPIC: Does the presentation establish a central idea?			
<p>EXCELLENT (A) Presentation has an appropriately focused topic with a clearly communicated understanding of the purpose for the speech.</p>	<p>GOOD (B) Presentation has a focused topic with partially demonstrated understanding of the purpose for the speech.</p>	<p>COMPETENT (C) Presentation has a somewhat focused topic or a vague sense of the purpose for the speech; the audience is required to make assumptions.</p>	<p>INSUFFICIENT (D) Presentation lacks focus or has a confused purpose; the audience is left confused</p>
ORGANIZATION: Is the development of ideas throughout the presentation successful?			
<p>EXCELLENT (A) Speech is clearly and logically organized with an engaging introduction, a logically sequenced body with appropriate transitions, and a clear and convincing conclusion.</p>	<p>GOOD (B) Speech makes a clear attempt at organization with a beginning, middle, and end, and an attempt to use transitions.</p>	<p>COMPETENT (C) Speech has some inconsistencies in organization and/or speech lacks a sustained focus throughout with an inconsistent use of transitions.</p>	<p>INSUFFICIENT (D) Speech shows a lack of organization, which makes it difficult to follow the speaker's ideas; speech may ramble without a clear beginning, middle, or end.</p>
LANGUAGE: What is the speaker's control of language?			
<p>EXCELLENT (A) Student uses sophisticated and varied language that is suited to the topic and audience; word choice is concise, original, and effectively conveys the appropriate tone given the purpose of the speech.</p>	<p>GOOD (B) Student uses appropriate language and word choice, but with less sophistication, expressiveness and/or originality.</p>	<p>COMPETENT (C) Student uses words that may be unsuited to the topic, audience, or purpose of the speech; word choice lacks originality and fails to convey an appropriate tone for the speech.</p>	<p>INSUFFICIENT (D) Student uses inappropriate language that distracts the audience because it is too informal or imprecise given the topic and the purpose of the speech.</p>
DELIVERY: Is the speech delivered in an appropriate and effective manner?			
<p>EXCELLENT (A) Speech includes a combination of appropriate and effective eye contact, clarity, and projection of voice, tone, and pace, and gestures significantly enhance the speaker's words.</p>	<p>GOOD (B) Speech includes a combination of appropriate eye contact, clarity, and projection of voice, tone, and pace, and gestures are used but not always smoothly.</p>	<p>COMPETENT (C) Speech includes an inconsistent use of eye contact, clarity, and projection of voice, tone, and pace, and/or gestures interrupt the flow of the speech.</p>	<p>INSUFFICIENT (D) Speech includes a lack of eye contact, clarity, and projection of voice, tone, and pace, and/or a lack of appropriate gestures make the speech difficult to follow.</p>
OVERALL EFFECTIVENESS: Was the speech overall successful?			
<p>EXCELLENT (A) Speaker remains enthusiastic, audience attention is maintained, and the purpose of the speech is achieved; speaker stays within allocated length of time.</p>	<p>GOOD (B) Speaker shows some enthusiasm, the audience remains mostly interested, and the purpose of the speech is achieved; speaker generally stays within allocated length of time.</p>	<p>COMPETENT (C) Speaker shows limited enthusiasm, audience interest is not sustained, and the purpose of the speech is only partially achieved; speaker strays out of allocated length of time.</p>	<p>INSUFFICIENT (D) Speaker lacks enthusiasm, the audience shows a lack of interest, and the purpose of the speech is not achieved; speaker considerably strays out of allocated length of time.</p>
